Event's Background	<p><b>RATIONALE:</b></p> <p>This <b>2018</b> marks the <b>26<sup>th</sup> year of the National Children's Month (NCM)</b> annually celebrated every <b>November</b> pursuant to <b>Republic Act No. 10661 s. 2015</b>, with the Council for the Welfare of Children (CWC), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and National Youth Commission (NYC) as the lead agencies.</p> <p>Earlier in May 2018, CWC launched the Philippine Plan of Action to End Violence Against Children (PPAEVAC) which translates the findings of the 2015 National Baseline Study on Violence Against Children (NBS-VAC) into specific action and results.</p> <p>The <b>2015 NBS-VAC</b> revealed that most Filipino <b>children</b> experience and are vulnerable to <b>physical, psychosocial and sexual violence in any setting, but it is significantly high in the home</b>. An alarming 3 in 5 children suffer one or two forms of violence at home, while parents and other members of the family (brothers, cousins and sisters) are often the perpetrators of abuse. In addition, it also showed that among children who sought help from authorities, the largest portion reached out to teachers (18.6%) and guidance counselors (6.7%).</p> <p>More importantly, the prevalence of violence in schools is almost equally disturbing.</p> <p>As approved by the Council Board in its Special Meeting conducted on 07 June 2018, the 26th NCM shall <b>focus on positive parenting</b>, with the theme <b>"ISULONG: TAMANG PAG-AARUGA PARA SA LAHAT NG BATA."</b></p> <p><b>Positive parenting</b> is the non-violent approach to parenting and caregiving children in their behavior while the parents acknowledge and respect their rights to a healthy development, protection from violence, and participation in their learning from infancy to adulthood.</p> <p>Meanwhile, positive discipline to teaching supports students' healthy development while respecting children's right to an active participation in learning free from violence. This is made possible through clear and consistent communication and consistent reinforcement of rules and limitations while applying empathy and respect for others.</p>
